Oppressed by others for hundreds of years, these native peoples have been forced to eke out a living on the slopes of volcanic peaks at the 9,000-12,000 ft. elevation level. Many families live in one-room cornstalk huts with dirt floors and no water or electricity. All proceeds from the quilt raffle will benefit the mission in the Diocese of Solalá.
