PALM SUNDAY



Already the proclamation of the Lord's Passion is upon us—and it always challenges us to look more deeply at just what we are capable of doing. Madeleine Delbrel wrote in the 1920's:

“The world news—however it reaches us: press, radio, personal contact—must not be for us just pieces of information. It mustn't be like posters that people look at with mild and sometimes intelligent interest... Our awareness that this is the way things happen in our day has various implications. Each person must have as unbiased and objective a view of himself as possible. He must ask himself: ‘What am I capable of doing?’ This awareness also requires of us a concern not to spoil, waste or allow to be lost the opportunities and provisions which God has given us.

For it is in *this* particular fleeting unique circumstance, in the wake of *this* particular event that *we* and not ‘others’ are called to be. If we stand by idly because we are unconscious of the need or turn a blind eye to it, there will not be time for our place to be taken by others. Today things move too fast... Today if we are not ready or are not preparing ourselves to be ready to follow the call of the moment we are guilty in our relationship to God of a kind of embezzlement.

In our relationship to the Church we are guilty of a most damaging act of sabotage.

All our miniscule, cruel acts of collusion have a part to play in [His] death....”

Where are you at the Passion?

Grant, we pray, almighty God,
that, though in our weakness we fail,
we may be revived through
the Passion of your Only Begotten Son.
Who lives and reigns with you
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, for ever and ever.
