Sadly, earlier this week some vandalism destroyed the statue of our Blessed Mother, which has graced the grounds of our school and parish since the beginning. It's important to keep some things in mind, we do not know at this time who the vandals were, and while we may have our suspicions, we certainly can't assign blame. In the future we will be looking to erect a concrete statue of our Blessed Mother and affix the statue permanently in a spot designed for her, where the original statue stood. Most of us at one time or another, have experienced anger and frustration that caused us to lash out and sometimes overreact. Vandalism is one result of this anger and frustration in the lives of people who don't know what to do with their emotions. Our best response, and the response of Christ, is to pray for those who have damaged our property, and to ask for the movement of the Holy Spirit in their lives. Imagine how important and powerful the prayers of 1500 people, directed towards one end: the conversion and healing of whoever has suffered so much. May God bring us always closer to one another, in reconciliation and peace, through the intercession of our Blessed Mother.

Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ!
