Several people have asked for a clarification on the new guidelines on posture at Mass -

“When is the correct time to begin kneeling for the Communion rite?”

The fractioning rite (the breaking of the bread), is a reminder to us of Christ’s action at the Last Supper and a completion of the words of institution that the Bread of Life might be shared and broken with all.

The priest generally genuflects at the end of the fractioning rite, in reverence and respect for Jesus’ presence and action among us.

At the genuflection, the living body of Christ, (the people of God), offer their reverence and respect as well, by kneeling.

The exposition of the body of Christ and the blood of Christ, beginning with the words “Behold, the Lamb of God”, invite us deeper into the mystery of communion.

Following the reception of Eucharist one can return to the pew and kneel, offering prayer or spending time in reflection and thanksgiving.

It is not necessary to remain kneeling until all people have received communion. For those whom kneeling is difficult, it is entirely acceptable to remain seated.

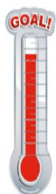
