THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

ALL SAINTS AND ALL SOULS Each year, as the Church celebrates the Feast of All Saints and the Commemoration of All Souls, we enter the final weeks of the liturgical year leading to the Feast of Christ the King. It is always a forward-looking time as we anticipate not only the second coming of Christ, but the renewal and re-creation of all that is. It is also a time of joyful anticipation of reunion with all those who have gone before us. The invitation to prayer for a funeral vigil reminds us: “we believe that all the ties of love and affection that knit us together in life, do not unravel in death...” This means that those who have loved us, continue to love us, and hold us in prayer until that time when we are gathered together in the fullness of the Kingdom of God. Our hope, as Christians, is in that promised Kingdom in which death has been conquered and the love which we share with one another will be brought to its fulfillment too. For this reason, during the month of November, we remember the lives of our loved ones: those who have loved us into life and those whom we have loved as they have passed into the arms of the Lord. Remembrance is always bittersweet—they have passed beyond the reach of our arms, but not beyond the reach of our prayers. The formally recognized saints of the Church are joined with the informally recognized saints of our lives until the time we are reunited in the mercy and love of our God.
